

Davis Girl Scout Service Unit Policies and Procedures for Gold Award Grants

(approved 12/08 by Davis Service Team – last date revised 1.14.18)

Goal of the Grants Program: To encourage girls from the Davis Service Unit to go for their Gold Award.

Eligibility: Individual girls who have had their Gold Award applications approved by the Council. While the grants are not necessarily based on need, need could certainly be taken into consideration, particularly if requests exceed available funds in a given year.

Timelines: Year-round application process with interview and decision within 4 weeks of request.

Gold Award Grant Application Process: *(requests to Carla Lehn, Davis Service Unit Treasurer: carlalehn@gmail.com)*

1. Submit full Gold Award proposal and budget, and proof of Council approval.
2. **All requests** should include a cover letter requesting a specific dollar amount (not to exceed \$100), and statement of willingness to make a brief report on her project at the Service Unit Bridging and Awards Ceremony in June if award granted. (Assuming event is held.)
3. Attend Grant interview. (professional attire please)

Interview Process

Purpose of Interview: Provide a professional interview experience with individuals who understand the goals of the program and skills that may be gained, but who do not personally know the girls being interviewed. (Panelists will recuse themselves if they know one of the applicants.)

Three member Interview panel:

- A previous Gold Award recipient
- A member of the Service Team not currently leading a Cadette, Senior or Ambassador troop.
- A Brownie or Junior Leader (to expose them to these older girl opportunities)

Possible Interview Questions:

1. Why did you select this project?
2. What do you hope to gain from this experience?
3. What will you use service unit funds for? And did you seek other sources of funds in the community?
4. How will this money make a difference for your project?

Purpose of Presentation at Service Unit Bridging and Awards Ceremony:

Provides a way to showcase Gold Award opportunities to younger girls, their leaders and parents, so they can see what lies ahead for them when they become older Girl Scouts.

At the Bridging Ceremony, Gold and Silver Award Recipients and Destinations Participants may be asked to make a brief presentation (5 – 10 minutes each).
