The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest award a Cadette can achieve. Earning the Girl Scout Silver Award involves the time to complete a Girl Scout Journey and then a suggested minimum of 50 hours.

- Be girl-led. That means based on the girls' interests and passions!
- Address a need in the community.
- Reach beyond Girl Scouting to make the world a better place
- Be completed individually or in small groups of 3-4 girls.
