Principal's Letter

Dear Parents,

Our New Year brings us Open House on February 28th. The date was moved earlier in the year so that our students and all parents of incoming 10-12th grade students would have an opportunity to get information on courses offered for 2013-14. You will be able to get a course catalogue that evening as well. Some of these courses need to be explained because there are often misconceptions about them. For example, Algebra 2/ Trigonometry is a course that takes almost two years of curriculum and fits it very very tightly into one year. Students who take this course are often not prepared for its pace. Pay careful attention to the prerequisites for all courses. We will be using an appeal system, not a waiver, for any students who do not have the required prerequisites. There is a positive correlation between students who take a class they are not academically prepared for and low grades, undue stress and/or requests to drop the class. These are also the students who need intensive assistance that often require costly tutoring outside of school.

We are offering two newer one-semester courses. One is Math 300, a college level math course for students who may not want to take Calculus or AP Statistics. Math 300: Introduction to Mathematical Ideas involves the study of math's fundamental systems including: numeration systems, logic, sets, number theory, algebraic modeling, geometry, combinatorics, probability, statistics, consumer mathematics, graph theory, voting and apportionment, and matrices. If your child wants a course that reinforces what they have learned in math and that demonstrates the theory behind it as well as the direct application of that knowledge, this would be a fantastic course for them. This course is designed to strengthen and deepen students' understanding of math. This is guaranteed college credit not one dependent on passing an AP exam. We will be also offering a one semester Introduction to Robotics course (pending board approval) that provides challenges for students from Algebra to Calculus and for those who want to see their knowledge of C/C++ put into action in creating and programming modular robots. We hope you can come to our Open House for more information about next year. Students will be selecting their 2013-14 courses online in March.

Many of you are aware that this was the first year we administered final exams before Winter Break. So far, the survey results have been solidly supportive of this pilot. The parent survey is available online until this coming Monday. Please take some time to give us your input.

Some of our students' comments about the final exam schedule include:

- I believe that having Winter Break after finals is essential at all costs. Winter Break should be a time of relaxation and enjoyment when students can spend time with their families and friends without feeling like they are jeopardizing their grades.
 I was able to have a complete duty free break.
- I didn't have to worry about finals or mountains of work. I prefer the semester to end then too so that we can really have time off.
- I had less to worry about as studying and all the "toil" of preparing for the arduous week of finals was already over.
- The change in finals schedule was probably the BEST Christmas gift I received.

I know that many of you have asked about how this might impact the school year calendar; it is still too soon to tell. We need to complete our data collecting and analysis to determine the efficacy on students' academic success and well-being. Elementary and Junior High sites will participate in a future survey in conjunction with on-going Board of Education discussion to determine if there is merit to a change in the school calendar. Our staff and PTA parents understand that the calendar for 2013-14 has already been voted on by our district teachers. However, the information from the surveys will be used to guide the district calendar committee as we start working on the 2014-15 calendar and beyond. When the calendar was recommended by the committee last Spring and voted on by DTA there were clearly mixed feelings among faculty regarding an earlier start to the school year in order to end the semester before the Winter break.

All our staff would like to extend our tremendous thanks for the food, cards, and gifts parents and students bestowed on us for the holiday and end of semester. The holiday and end of semester thanks and heart-felt appreciation for our work will carry us though many a long night's work.

Counseling Corner

We welcome spring semester as being a fresh start. It is an exciting time for seniors as they wait to hear from colleges and start planning for Senior Ball, graduation, and GRAD NIGHT. Beware of "senioritis." Remind your student that the senior year does count for college. When the final transcript is sent to the chosen college, grades are reviewed to make sure that the GPA was maintained and no "D" or "F" grades were earned. When students receive a college acceptance, this is a "conditional acceptance" based on final grades. If a student does not maintain his/her grades, the college acceptance will be "rescinded."

Our juniors and sophomores will start program planning for the 2013-2014 school year when counselors meet with World Civilization and US History classes on February 13th and 14th.

Open House will be on February 28 from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Teachers will be available to explain course content, AP/honors courses, and courses that require applications and interviews including AVID, Yearbook, The Hub, and LEAD. The music teachers will be available to explain the audition process for our music groups. The intention of having Open House earlier this year is to give students and parents an opportunity to understand course content prior to selecting courses.

When students select courses, they need to consider them as permanent choices. We develop a master schedule based on what students requested. We then hire staff to teach these courses. It takes several months to plan the master schedule and hire staff. The DSHS catalog includes charts to assist students in making sure they have their graduation requirements, meet 16 core requirements for NCAA, and a-g course requirements. During February and March, students should schedule an appointment with their counselor to review their transcript and course selections for next year to make sure they are on track for meeting high school graduation and college requirements.

We have carefully reviewed all the prerequisites listed in the catalog to make sure they were UC/CSU approved and Board of Education approved. Students may only sign up for courses where they have met the prerequisite requirements.

HYBRID ONLINE COURSES: Last semester, for the first time, DSIS offered online courses for English 10 (a-g approved) and English 11 for students who needed to replace D or F grades. This semester, the program has expanded to offering English 10, American Literature and fall semester of US History. All 3 of these online courses are a-g approved. Students who need to replace a D or F grade may take these courses. The program includes a weekly meeting at DSIS with a teacher. Interested students may contact their counselor for further information.

STRESS/ANXIETY: Discussions about stress/anxiety are increasing among students. One of the primary stressors mentioned is worrying about getting into a "good" college. Other stressors mentioned include: How can they resolve conflicts with family members, peers, or teachers? How many AP/honors courses should they take? When they no longer have balance in their lives, how do they gain it back? (Example: Student gives up music or a sport because s/he has to devote all spare time to completing homework.) What determines if they will be defined as being successful or a failure in life? Our counselors and LEAD class are focusing this semester on developing support systems and coping strategies for students in an effort to reduce stress/anxiety.

Upcoming Health Awareness Lectures

Are you interested in a career in the medical profession, topics in health, and/or just interested in eating well, and taking good care of your skin and body? Then come meet some engaging doctors and attend the upcoming lecture series organized by the Teen Health Awareness Club which will be held at lunchtime in S5.

On Wednesday Feb 20th Dr. Amy Chen will lecture on "Healthy Eating".Dr Chen was a middle school teacher who became a pediatrician and now works for Kaiser Permanente in the Davis offices.

On Tuesday March 19th Dr. Eric Fromer will lecture on "Unblemished truths for your skin care". He will cover information on skin cancer/ melanoma, impact of tanning, skin aging, acne, and briefly other common concerns such as tattooing, piercing, nail care and common rashes. He practices dermatology at the Vacaville Kaiser Medical Center. Healthy snacks will be provided. See you there!

SAT Preparation Workshop

A workshop stressing SAT test-taking strategies and good use of time will be presented in February and March by Davis Adult School. The class is for high school students who are preparing to take the SAT college entrance exam. The SAT college entrance exam tests grammar and usage, reading comprehension of short passages, and content from third-year high school math. Instruction will include review of vocabulary and math concepts, when to make an educated guess, and how to pace yourself.

The class is limited to 24 students and is offered Wednesday evenings 6:30 - 8:30 pm February 13, 20, 27, and March 6 on the Davis High School campus. Register at Davis Adult School, corner of Oak Avenue & 14th Street, 10:00 am -1:00 pm and 2:00 - 7:00 pm. Download a form from our website to register by mail; or register online through our website at www.djusd.kt2.ca.lus/adultschool. Cost is \$85.

Career Center News

Scholarships: Scholarship season is here! Scholarships offered by local businesses and organizations for Davis High School students will be announced in the Scholarship Bulletin in February and March. We encourage students to apply for these local scholarships! The Scholarship Bulletin can be found in the Career Center, the Career Center's webpage (on the DSHS website click on counseling, click on Career Center, click on Scholarship Bulletin), or on Naviance.

FAFSA/Cal Grant: To be considered for financial aid and Cal Grants, students must submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 2. For Cal Grants, the high school has electronically submitted all senior GPA's to the California Student Aid Commission. This means students do not have to complete a paper GPA verification form to be considered for a Cal Grant.

PSAT Results: Many students who took the PSAT on campus in the fall have still not picked up their test results. Students can come to the Career Center to pick up their test results.

Summer Activities: It's not too early to start thinking about summer activities. Some summer programs have early spring deadlines. Information about summer programs, study in the U.S., study abroad, travel, recreation, conservation programs and volunteering can be found in the Career Center.

ACADEMIC CENTER

The Academic Center offers tutoring support in all academic subjects. All tutors are current college students or alumni with varying majors. Computers, a printer, textbooks, and project supplies are available for students' use. The center is open Monday-Thursday 7:30 am-4:30 pm and Friday 7:30 am-3:30 pm.
