Band Booster Presidents' Message

APRIL HAS FLOWN BY AND WE ARE NOW COUNTING DOWN to the end of the year. The students had a great time in Southern California with clinics at UCLA and Disneyland and performances on the Big Thunder Ranch Jamboree stage in Disneyland. It was great to see so many families, extended families, and friends of families come to see the performances and join in the fun.

The Jazz Band had an early morning performance at the Reno Jazz Festival on April 27. They played great and placed fourth in their division based on school size. This is a huge festival that draws participants primarily from throughout the western United States. We had the opportunity to hear some great professional, high school, and college bands during the event.

And so we wind up the year with three concerts in May. First up is the final Symphonic Band concert on May 7. Seniors in all the bands will be recognized at this concert and we hope to see everyone there.

Next, the Jazz Band is featured in the Jazz on a Summer's Eve concert on May 23 at 7:30pm in the Veteran's Memorial Theater.

And finally, our outreach concert for the community, *Picnic and Pops*, on May 29, in Central Park. This year we will be joined by the combined DaVinci, Emerson, Holmes (DEH) bands in a multi-school Festival of Music and Arts. DEH will play at 5:15pm followed by the DHS Combined Band at 6:00pm. The Cal Aggie Band-uh will join the year-end celebration at 7:00pm.

There are many ways to volunteer and a list of the open positions is provided separately in this newsletter on page 7. If you are interested in volunteering, please let one of the officers know. If you have questions about any of the volunteer positions, we're happy to answer. Director's Message

Wow! APRIL WAS A VERY BUSY TIME FOR DHS BANDS! We enjoyed a wonderful trip to the Los Angeles area, participating in a clinic at UCLA with the Director of Bands, Gordon Henderson. Then we had a great time in the park, followed by performances in Disneyland and a great recording session with Disneyland clinicians. The resultant videos produced by Disney are strikingly remarkable and the experience was very educational.

We also recently returned from the Reno Jazz Festival, where the Jazz Band had a good performance and a 4th place finish (out of 17 bands, one of which was a Festival Showcase Performer at the evening awards). We were all surprised to see Mr. Lange in the performance site and were quite pleased to see his kind comments and encouraging score (he gave us the highest score of all three judges)! Overall, this was a very educational opportunity and we look forward to many more next year!

Upcoming events in May are as exciting! On May 7th, we will have our *Senior Concert*, where we recognize graduating seniors and play a concert with the Symphonic Band of music selected by this group. Next up is our final Jazz Ensemble Concert, *Jazz on a Summer's Eve*, held at the Veteran's Memorial Center. We conclude our formal concerts with both the Concert and Symphonic Bands playing their repertoire from Spring Tour at the *Picnic and Pops Concert* in Central Park on May 29th.

We are currently completing our scale-playing tests (melodic minor) in Concert Band. Many students are doing a great job and we should be finished by the end of May. Remember, students who don't satisfactorily complete these tests lose 20 points per test. Also, those who do complete these tests earn 20 points for each scale test successfully completed. **Parents**: Please encourage your students to work hard and learn these scales through regular daily practice.

✓ Please submit all points to Mr. Slabaugh by Friday, May 24th in order to receive full credit (unless the points were accrued during the last week of the quarter.) Any points submitted after the due date will receive only half-credit.

Concert Write-ups are a great way to earn points towards your grade. Refer to the course syllabus for more information. If you attend concerts, take the time to do the write up and earn points towards your final grade!

Band Booster Minutes ~ March 28, 2013

THE MEETING WAS CALLED to order at 7:30pm.

Minutes – A motion for the approval of the minutes of the March 6 Booster meeting was made and seconded, and it passed by voice vote. The minutes from tonight's meeting will be posted in the upcoming newsletter for consideration on May 8^{th} .

Band Director's Report – Mr. Tom Slabaugh gave the Director's Report. The bands have prepared music for their events at UCLA and Disneyland. The junior high and senior high school instrumental music teachers, Tom Slabaugh, Angelo Moreno, Clyde Quick, and Nancy Sanchez, held auditions together for next year's symphonic band and orchestra. Slabaugh, Quick, and Sanchez held the auditions for next year's jazz band. Mr. Slabaugh is projecting a shortage of French horns and tubas in the bands, so he is likely to target next year's Lange scholarships to those instruments. Slabaugh and Moreno anticipate an unusually large number of double reed players will enter the high school music program over the next couple of years.

Treasurer's Report – Deepali Bhargava provided the Treasurer's Report for review at the meeting.

available in the case of emergencies. The checking account starts each school year with a balance of about \$15,000, then increases as we deposit all the funds raised during the year. The checking account balance typically gets quite large just before we start writing checks related to trip expenses, then it drops rapidly. Our goal is to again have a year-end checking account balance of at least \$15,000.

Committee Reports and Volunteer Opportunities

Disneyland Spring Trip, April 11–15 – John Kraft, Otto Raabe, and Katie Horn are coordinating a wonderful trip. The trip includes clinics at UCLA. Performances and soundtrack sessions will be held at Disneyland. Final installments of trip contributions are due now, as well as permission forms and medical forms. Most bills have been paid.

Coconut Grove (March 9) — Chair: Gurbinder Nijjar. Coconut Grove was a wonderful evening of jazz music

and dinner conversation. The estimated net revenue is \$6,000-\$6,500, with a few bills outstanding.

Adjudication Festival (March 23) – Co-chairs: Amy Levin and Anula Danilowicz-Drown. The festival was held on Saturday, March 23 in the IPAB from 9am-4pm. The adjudicators were Richie Hodge and Meryl Wamhoff. Jamba Juice and Hot Dogger sold food throughout the day.

Other activities were briefly discussed:

Newsletter – Pat McGuire requested articles and photos for upcoming newsletters. He pointed out that he has received a good selection of jazz band photos for previous newsletters, but he requests that parents remember to take photos of the concert and symphonic bands to complement the jazz band photos.

Scrip – Scrip program continues with local stores. Rick Tan told us about efforts to start fundraising with the new Whole Foods store in Davis. Rick and Jennifer are still in early stages of the process and will update us at future meetings.

Senior Concert – In previous years senior band students have been recognized at the end of the school year. Tom would like to continue that tradition. At the Senior Concert in May, seniors will wear red carnations and will be individually acknowledged. At the DHS graduation ceremony in June band students will wear maroon honor cords.

Old Business – Discussion continued on the poster, shelving, and IPAB ticket options to address fire safety concerns.

New Business – The consideration of high school reconfiguration to include ninth grade was discussed.

Among the anticipated challenges are too few high school music instructors and too small facilities to accommodate the larger number of students. The classroom, PA-3, and the Brunelle Theater would be too small for an expanded music program. At the most recent concert, band parents and other members of the community were turned away to comply with the Fire Marshall's maximum capacity for the theater. Adding a 9th grade class to the bands would only exacerbate that problem. In the current system, we have a total of 133 students in concert and symphonic bands (63 + 70). Mr. Slabaugh estimates that the capacity of PA-3 when students

are using instruments and music stands is approximately 80 students per class. The band program has been growing at the elementary and junior high levels; Mr. Slabaugh anticipates a large class of 100 incoming sophomore band musicians in two years. The student:teacher ratio is already a very high 65:1, and the capacity of the classroom does not allow those students to be simply added to existing classes. Further, since the classroom is used for six periods each day, it is not feasible to add new classes/ensembles to accommodate those additional students that would join the band and strings programs. Would we be forced to somehow ration access to the music program, or will the district be willing and able to invest in additional facilities and instructors so that we can continue to welcome all students interested in taking band and orchestra classes?

Another concern related to the reorganization is continued access to music for the DaVinci students, especially the junior high students. Currently, DaVinci Jr. High shares a campus with Emerson Jr. High, and students from both schools are in music classes together. One of the reorganization rumors mentioned at the meeting suggests that one of the current junior high schools might be closed, and the Da-Vinci Jr. High and DaVinci Sr. High would both be relocated to the closed school's campus. Parents are concerned that if there are no band classes on the DaVinci campus junior high students might be unable to travel to a different junior high school campus during the school day to participate in music classes. If that model were to become reality, would DaVinci Jr. High students be unable to take music classes, or would the district be willing and able to either hire additional music teachers or provide transportation for students to travel to music classes on a different campus?

A motion was made and approved unanimously that the band boosters group should notify the school board and administration of our concerns. We specifically agreed that a letter should be written that expresses our "concerns" but that does not provide or withhold "support" at this time for any proposed reorganization models.

This meeting was adjourned.

High School Reconfiguration Update

AT THE APRIL 18 DJUSD BOARD OF TRUSTEES meeting the Board decided not to immediately consider reconfiguration of Davis Senior High School to a 9–12 campus. After public comment, a presentation by district staff, and extensive Board discussion, the trustees decided instead to conduct a district-wide strategic planning effort. The Board will further discuss the strategic planning efforts at their May 2 meeting and develop a plan for community involvement in the process.

On the Agenda for the May 2 meeting:

"On April 18 the BoE directed staff to bring back the name or names of a consultant(s) to facilitate a strategic

plan and a description of the process, including first steps and how the community would be involved. No PowerPoint will accompany this brief presentation. The superintendent is still interviewing consultants and expects to have up to date information by May 2."
