

## Old North group forms

Two dozen residents of Davis' Old North area gathered Sunday afternoon at the Hattie Weber Museum and unanimously adopted a set of bylaws establishing the Old North Davis Neighborhood Association.

This new association joins about a dozen others formed or forming under the city of Davis' Community Partnership Program. Facilitated by Anne Brunette, community partnership coordinator, the purpose of the program is to foster joint city-neighborhood problem-solving.

In a recent survey, Old North residents identified the three most important problems of their neighborhood as parking, traffic safety and the maintenance and improvement of its urban forest. These will be among the new association's top priorities for joint action with the city,

a spokesman said.

Seven members of the new board of directors also were elected. Four of the them will serve as officers: Tom Cross, president; Angela Willson, vice president; Andy Wallace, secretary; and Ian Gardner, treasurer. The other three members, who are directors-at-large, are Tom Cross, John Lofland and Dan Quickert.
