The Emergency Plan includes information on Management responsibilities during a power outage, a major gas leak or a Park evacuation. The plan also provides information on how to prepare for various disasters, what to do during an emergency, and a Red Cross Family Disaster Plan form to share with your family members.

- **Before an emergency**, decide how you will get in contact with family members near and far, and where you will go.
- **The reality of a disaster situation** means that you will likely not have access to most conveniences. To plan in advance, think through the details of your everyday life.
- **Create a kit of emergency supplies** for a Stay-in-Place Plan. The first step is to consider how an emergency might affect your individual needs. Plan to make it on your own, for at least a week in your home. It's possible that you will not have access to a medical facility or even a drugstore.
- **Evacuation:** There may be conditions in which you will decide to leave or there may be situations when you may be ordered to go. In addition to all of the items in your stay-at-home supply kit, you should have items in a “grab and go bag” in one location for an evacuation scenario..
- **The RY Emergency Plan** has a list of things you will need for both Stay-in-Place and Evacuation events. We all should PLAN AHEAD!
